

Written assignment: exercises marked with (H), due on March 15.

1. Show that formula

$$\begin{pmatrix} a & b \\ c & d \end{pmatrix} z = \frac{az + b}{cz + d}$$

defines a left group action of $\mathrm{SL}_2(\mathbb{R})$ in the upper halfplane $\mathcal{H} = \{z \in \mathbb{C} : \mathrm{Im}(z) > 0\}$.

2. Let $k \geq 0$ be an integer and $V = \{f : \mathcal{H} \rightarrow \mathbb{C}\}$ be the space of holomorphic functions in the upper halfplane. Show that formula

$$\left(f \Big|_k \begin{pmatrix} a & b \\ c & d \end{pmatrix}\right)(z) = \frac{1}{(cz + d)^k} f\left(\frac{az + b}{cz + d}\right)$$

defines a right group action of $\mathrm{SL}_2(\mathbb{R})$ in V .

- (H)3. (*Poisson summation on the real line*) Let $g : \mathbb{R} \rightarrow \mathbb{C}$ be a differentiable function of rapid decay, that is $|g(x)| = O(|x|^{-c})$ and $|g'(x)| = O(|x|^{-c})$ when $x \rightarrow \infty$ for some $c > 1$. Its Fourier transform is defined as

$$\hat{g}(y) = \int_{-\infty}^{+\infty} g(x) e^{-2\pi i x y} dx.$$

Prove that

$$\sum_{n \in \mathbb{Z}} \hat{g}(n) = \sum_{n \in \mathbb{Z}} g(n).$$

- (H)4. Use previous exercise to prove the Lipschitz formula

$$\sum_{n \in \mathbb{Z}} \frac{1}{(z + n)^k} = \frac{(-2\pi i)^k}{(k-1)!} \sum_{r=1}^{\infty} r^{k-1} e^{2\pi i r z}.$$

for integer $k \geq 2$ and $z \in \mathcal{H}$.

- (H)5. Use the Lipschitz formula to compute the Fourier coefficients of the Eisenstein series

$$G_k(z) = \frac{1}{2} \sum_{\substack{m, n \in \mathbb{Z} \\ (m, n) \neq (0, 0)}} \frac{1}{(mz + n)^k}.$$

($k \geq 4$, even).

6. The Bernoulli numbers B_0, B_1, \dots are defined by the generating function

$$\frac{x}{e^x - 1} = \sum_{k=0}^{\infty} B_k \frac{x^k}{k!}.$$

Prove Euler's formula for the values

$$\zeta(k) = -\frac{B_k (2\pi i)^k}{2 k!}$$

of the Riemann zeta function $\zeta(s) = \sum_{n=1}^{\infty} n^{-s}$ at even integers $k = 2, 4, 6, \dots$

Make a conclusion about rationality of Fourier coefficients of the (renormalized) Eisenstein series

$$E_k(z) = G_k(z) / \zeta(k).$$
